THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



G'day

I was thinking the other day, what a complex fabric it is that makes up a club such as ours. We bring together people of different ages; from different walks of life and backgrounds; we have a wide range of personalities; preferences; and motivations. We love our music, we love to perform and we are passionate people. On the whole I see the club as friendly, welcoming, fair and open; more a family than a club. But just like any family from time to time there will be issues, tensions, and conflict. It is inevitable that mistakes will be made; egos will get bruised; boundaries will be pushed and I'm afraid that occasionally it will end in tears.

As president, it concerns me when members become disgruntled. However, I'm not so naïve to believe that it's possible to keep all of the people happy all of the time. If there are concerns I'd prefer they're raised and addressed rather than being left to fester below the surface. As I once read: *just because nobody complains, doesn't necessarily mean that all parachutes are perfect.*

Our recent political leaders have gone to great lengths to show us (by example) that if we endeavour to keep everyone happy we are destined for failure; and by the same token if we choose to ignore the sentiments of the members (allegedly) for the overall good of the club, we are also flirting with disaster. Good management won't always win a popularity contest, nor should it be so autocratic that it dictates to the membership. We walk a fine line; on one hand the club is bigger than the individual, but on the other the club exists for its members. We try to be open and fair, foster our juniors, provide good quality entertainment to our audience; and of course not go broke. How hard could it be?

Currently, thanks to good management rather than good luck, the club is enjoying a prosperous period. Other clubs admire us, envy us and try to emulate us. But in some ways our success is our own worst enemy. While we continue to grow we find ourselves constrained by the physical size of our infrastructure and by the time available to accommodate our performers (at practices and socials). To a certain extent it is possible for us to expand our facilities but unfortunately we cannot create more time, so we must manage the available time as best we can. Some clubs restrict performers at socials to members only; members first; first in first served; some even draw up a roster to determine who performs, when and for how long. I'm not a great believer in solving every problem by creating more rules or by putting up more signs. I would prefer that we attack these challenges by utilising common sense, fairness, compromise and mutual respect.

If you have a concern or feel hardly done by, or if you feel that rules or actions of the club are unfair, I encourage you to have your say, voice your opinion; raise the matter at one of the monthly committee meetings. I can't guarantee you'll get your way, but at the very least you should receive an explanation and if necessary a review of the decision, rule, or

protocol to ensure it does stand up to scrutiny. But be prepared to be disappointed; if you're still not satisfied, so be it.

I ask you to remember that your committee, sub-committees, office bearers, and volunteers endeavour to act in the best interests of the club and its members. It's not always easy but hopefully we'll get it right more often than not. In any club, as in life, we all have to make compromises. In fact, if we were to have a club motto I would suggest it would be in Latin, and it would translate to *"it's not all about me"*.

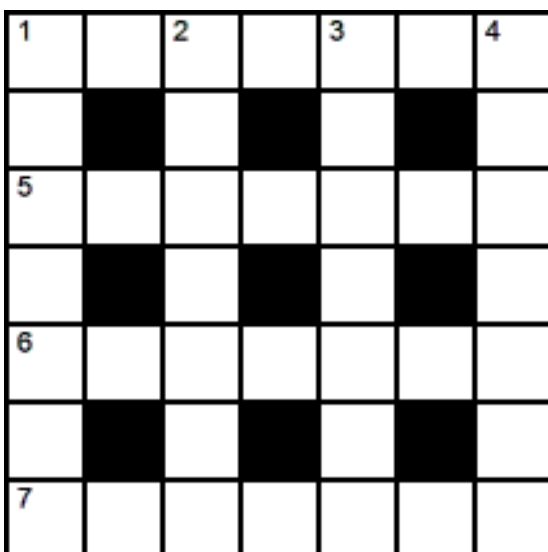

INFORMATION FOR WALK UP ARTISTS

All walk-up artists should report to the MC as soon as possible after arriving. The Social's Program Committee organise the evening's program (i.e. the time in which you appear on stage) from the list of names provided to them by the MC. If you arrive after 5pm please immediately report to the MC. The Social's Program Committee will do their best to slot you into the program, but with limited time available it is not always possible to accommodate everyone.

Please refer to the white board (left of the stage) which will display the order in which walk-up artists appear.

Each artist may perform two songs, with no encores, three songs for duets, or a total of 15 minutes for bands. Please advise the stage hands if you require backing. Chord charts for backing musicians are always helpful and preferable.

There is a room behind stage for your preparation. You must be report to the stage hands and be ready and waiting back stage at least 10 minutes before your performance. Please ensure instruments are tuned before going on stage.

Redcliffe Country Music Club



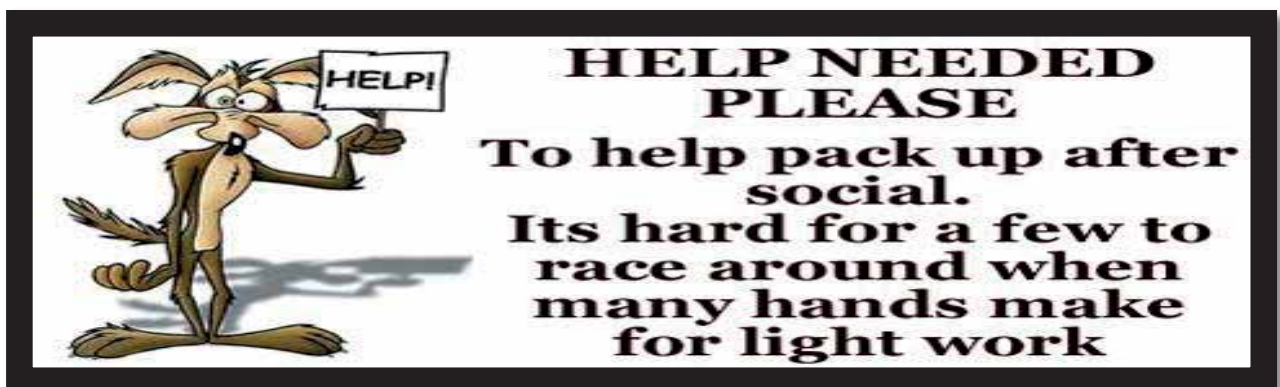
